World Conference on Doping in Sport 12-15 November 2013 South Africa

The Southern Africa Region and Africa as a whole was greatly honoured through the successful convention of the World Conference on Doping in Sport which took place at the Sandton Convention Centre in Johannesburg, South Africa in November last year. The event was an important milestone in sport which facilitated the successful adoption of the new World Anti-Doping Code and the change of guard at the helm of the World Anti –Doping Agency (WADA).

Sir Craig Reedie was elected to the position of President of WA-DA whilst former Minister of Sport and Recreation for South Africa, Reverend Dr. Makhenkesi Stofile was elected Vice President.

The World Conference was attended by many sports leaders from various organizations and the delegates unanimously agreed to protect the rights of clean athletes to compete in sport which is free doping. There was consensus on the need to redouble efforts in educating young athletes as way of preventing doping in sport.

The Africa Zone VI RADO was provided with a grant of US\$ 49 015 in August 2013 to undertake training of Doping Control Officers (DCOs) as well as educational outreach programs within Member States.

26 DCOs were trained from 25-27 August 2013 in Johannesburg, South Africa . The DCOs will play an important role in helping Member States attain compliance with the World Anti-Doping Code and UNESCO International Convention Against Doping in Sport through provision of quality doping control testing services. All eleven(11) Member States of Africa Zone VI RADO have ratified the UNESCO International Convention. The Africa Zone VI RADO is very grateful for this partnership with UNESCO which has helped to build capacity of the organization in terms of testing programs and increasing awareness about the dangers of doping in sport to athletes and coaches in the region. At this meeting , the Board expressed their condolences to the Government and People of South Africa on occasion of the passing away of the iconic statesman. The Board deliberated on amongst other things, the 2014 Budget and Operational Plan which will guide the activities of the Africa Zone VI RADO.

In addition to the Board meeting, an Anti-Doping Education Workshop was also held to train Education Officers from various Member States. The workshop was facilitated by Mr. Tony Cunningham (WADA Manager — Education & Program Development). Member States developed plans for education which will be implemented in all the eleven (11) Member States beginning 2014.
